Overview: During the time period of June 7 to June 14, there were **86,249** mentions of Medicare for all. Comparatively, net neutrality garnered 24,371 mentions during the same time period.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

On Tuesday, June 11, the American Medical Association (AMA) [voted](#) 53% to 47% against adopting an amendment to remove the AMA's formal opposition to a single-payer health care system, despite pressure by a large contingent of medical students.


