



State Regulatory Responses to COVID-19

- * In recent weeks, state regulators have been issuing emergency regulations, guidance documents, and press releases responding to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. Going forward, recent updates will be included in *red*.
- * The below survey documents state responses to COVID-19 in the following areas:
 - Declaring a State of Emergency. All fifty states and the District of Columbia have declared a state of emergency, granting the states access to emergency funds, the National Guard, and other resources to assist affected entities and communities.
 - **Restricting Large Gatherings**. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has issued <u>interim guidance</u> recommending that, <u>for the next eight weeks</u>, organizers cancel or postpone in-person events that consist of 50+ people throughout the United States. Separately, President Trump has advised that individuals avoid gatherings with more than 10 people. States, however, have taken disparate approaches—some have adopted the CDC's guidance, others permit larger gatherings, and some states are silent on the issue altogether.
 - Limiting Operations of Restaurants/Bars. An increasing number of states are limiting the operations of restaurants and bars. Specifically, a select number of states effectively prohibit on-premises consumption in a restaurant. These rules do, however, continue to permit take-out, drive-through, and pick-up options.
 - **Restricting Operations of Other Facilities.** As with restaurants and bars, some states have enacted prohibitions applicable to other retail establishments (e.g., entertainment facilities to the public, including theaters, casinos, and bowling alleys; shopping malls; and gyms and spas).
 - *Closing Schools*. Many states have closed schools through the end of March 2020, with some—like Kansas—extending remote-learning through the end of the school year.
 - **Postponing Elections**. A minority of states have delayed their local or presidential primary elections.
 - *Offering Guidance on Insurance Coverage*. Nearly every state has issued guidance to consumers and the insurance industry alike governing issues ranging from cost-sharing obligations, immunizations, telehealth opportunities, access to information, and more.

Not every state has addressed each of these issues, and some states have incorporated other important reforms (e.g., unemployment benefits, paid-family leave, visitation at long-term care facilities, etc.). To the extent possible, we have included such references below.

* The below survey details the available state resources, the date on which the resources were issued, and a brief summary offering a general overview of the guidance offered. The initial table provides a high-level overview of the broader survey and contains corresponding state links that refer to the entries in the detailed survey.



* We envision this as an evergreen document that we will aim to update on a biweekly basis. If you operate in a state and notice that we have not included the most up-to-date guidance, please let us know.
