Newly Included Legislative Updates

• March 3: Sen. Martha McSally (R-AZ) introduced the Lowering Prescription Drug Prices for America's Seniors and Families Act (S. 3384), which requires HHS to promulgate regulations allowing individuals to import certain drugs from approved Canadian pharmacies, among other things.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> In general, HHS will find an excessive price when the domestic average manufacturing price for any brand name drug exceeds the median price charged for such drug in the 5 reference countries.
