The old rules requiring work-relatedness would go away for COVID claims. The costs for such claims could be enormous to insurers or large self-insured groups. Those costs will ultimately be passed on in increased workers compensation premiums to you!

Dear Governor Newsom:

We are writing because we've just learned that you are considering making a fundamental change to the system, mandating that all employees working outside of the home who contract COVID-19 during the shelter in place order will automatically be covered by worker's compensation. As we understand it, there would be no opportunity to review or rebut the claim and an actual, positive test would not be required.

If all industries are now forced to pay workers' comp for COVID-19 infections that are claimed to have occurred at the workplace, with no ability for companies or insurance to investigate the veracity of the claim, workers' comp costs will dramatically increase across the board. All of this would happen at precisely the wrong time when the economy attempts to restart in the weeks or months ahead.

We would ask instead that you limit the irrebuttable presumption of compensability for "front line" first responders, hospital workers, and those providing direct patient care to infected individuals. But all other workers, essential or otherwise, should continue to follow existing workers' comp guidelines and processes.

Governor, we appreciate the leadership you've shown in the face of this terrible virus. And you've made some bold decisions that have protected the health of millions of Californians. We respectfully ask, therefore, that you apply that same measured and thoughtful approach to workers' compensation given the complexity of what is at stake, including the survival of our economy.
