



COVID-19 Health Insurance Federal Legislation Tracker

<p>Families First Coronavirus Response Act H.R. 6201/H. Res. 904 Steptoe Analysis</p>	<p>Requires group health plans and group/individual health insurers to provide coverage for certain tests and services (e.g., in vitro diagnostics and general coronavirus-related items/services furnished to an individual) without cost-sharing, prior authorization, or any other medical management requirements.</p> <p>Incorporates various other provisions related to coronavirus relief, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Appropriates Medicaid funding for states and territories; • Establishes various nutrition waivers; • Provides job-protected leave to care for family members as a result of a coronavirus-related quarantine or closures; • Provides assistance to states for unemployment insurance benefits; • Requires certain employers to provide paid sick leave to employees who miss work due to coronavirus; and • Provides refundable payroll tax credits for employers and self-employed individuals who provide required paid sick leave or paid family leave due to coronavirus-related illness. <p><i>March 14 & 17 – Approved by the House.</i></p> <p><i>March 18 – Approved by the Senate and <u>enacted</u> by the President.</i></p>
<p>Covering Coronavirus Test Act of 2020 H.R. 6173 Rep. Diana DeGette (D-CO)</p>	<p>Requires group health plans and group/individual health insurers to cover testing for COVID-19 without cost-sharing requirements.</p>
<p>Care for COVID-19 Act S. 3442 Sen. Cory Booker (D-NJ)</p>	<p>Requires group health plans and group/individual health insurers to cover certain care for COVID-19 without cost-sharing requirements, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diagnostic services; • Supportive care; • Vaccines; • Prescription drugs; • Medical devices; • Inpatient and outpatient physician and hospital services; and • Any other services HHS determines appropriate.

	Establishes special enrollment periods for individuals diagnosed with or have presumptive positive diagnosis of COVID-19.
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
